Wrap: This might remind you all of last week's standings, and that's no reason to worry, because it is of course the exact top four that the nation saw in the week one standings of the BCS. With mostly convincing victories by all four of the top teams, the polls saw no reason to change the top four of the BCS. The top five of the BCS exactly mirror that of the first week's standings, and the only team to drop in the entire top nine was Oklahoma State, who after their close loss to Texas, still have a respectable BCS average at #9. USC, who dropped in both human elements, got some help from the computers, who jumped them from a tie for tenth in their ranking system to the sixth spot, which helped them stay ahead of Georgia, Florida and Texas Tech, all of whom saw their human element rankings improve drastically over the weekend. Utah and Boise State continue to vie for that singular BCS buster position, as both enter the top 11 this week. The top three teams have truly separated themselves from the pack, and will most likely not get jumped by any team below them without a loss. Texas Tech will face off against Texas this upcoming weekend, which will finish Texas's four game stretch of ranked opponents, and will likely knock the winner of the match up out of the national title chase.

Human Poll Wrap: USC, with their much closer than expected victory over Arizona, falls a surprising amount in the week two BCS human poll element. Texas Tech and Florida were able to either jump or stay ahead of USC in the polls this weekend, after they showcased much more convincing performances. Utah and Boise State continue to thrive in the middle of the human element, both getting love from the poll voters, and positioning themselves for that BCS Buster roll. With BYU's loss a week and a half ago, the BCS buster contenders will not be facing each other, each will need the other to lose in order to secure that BCS bid, otherwise, it seems as though Utah will likely be the first non-BCS school to make a second BCS bowl, after they achieved that feat in 2004.

Wrap: Harrell, a product of the epic Texas Tech spread offense which has created some of the most efficient quarterbacks in FBS/Division 1A history, continues to put up numbers worthy of his predecessors, and his 386 yard performance against Kansas over the weekend has thrust his name into the national spotlight and was more than enough to get his name onto the BCS Know How Heisman Watch rankings. A combination of the accuracy of Colt McCoy and the strength and efficiency of Sam Bradford, this third Big 12 QB may be one to watch out for. McCoy and Bradford continued to shine over the weekend, both preformed on an acceptable level, although neither had spectacular days. Ringer had another great game against Michigan, after a less than exciting performance against Ohio State in the Spartan's loss.
